to get to work



Where do you need to go?

If you are considering a new job, going to school, or just want to find an easier way to get to where you need to go, this guide can help.

Here are the three steps you'll need to take to determine your best way to get there:

1. Are you traveling locally or regionally?

See the panel to the right to learn the difference between local and regional, and what travel options are available for each.

2. Find your starting and ending points on the map.

See the map on the inside of this brochure.

3. Find your transit provider.

For bus schedules, fares, and other information contact the transit provider in your area.





Local or Regional? What's the difference?

LOCAL

If you need to go within the same or neighboring town

Take the bus

REGIONAL

If you need to go across town lines

Take the bus

Coastal Link (Milford to Norwalk)

7 Link (Norwalk to Danbury)

I-BUS (Stamford to White Plains, NY)

Take the train

New Haven Line and Shore Line East commuter rail and Commuter Connection shuttles from train stations to employers (Greenwich, Stamford, South Norwalk, Westport and Milford)

Join an Easy Street[®] Van

For a fixed monthly fare, 6-10 riders can share an Easy Street[®] van to work. Save up to \$300 per month, depending on the length of your commute. Easy Street[®] offers over 300 routes daily, transporting thousands of commuters who live or work in Connecticut to their jobs.

Join the NuRide Network

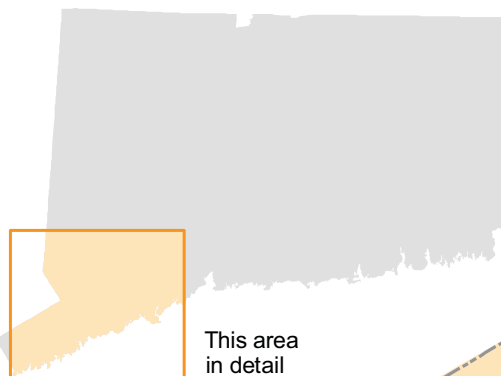
Cut the cost of commuting when you join NuRide's online network to share a ride to work. Through the NuRide network, arrange ridesharing trips and earn reward points every time you ride.

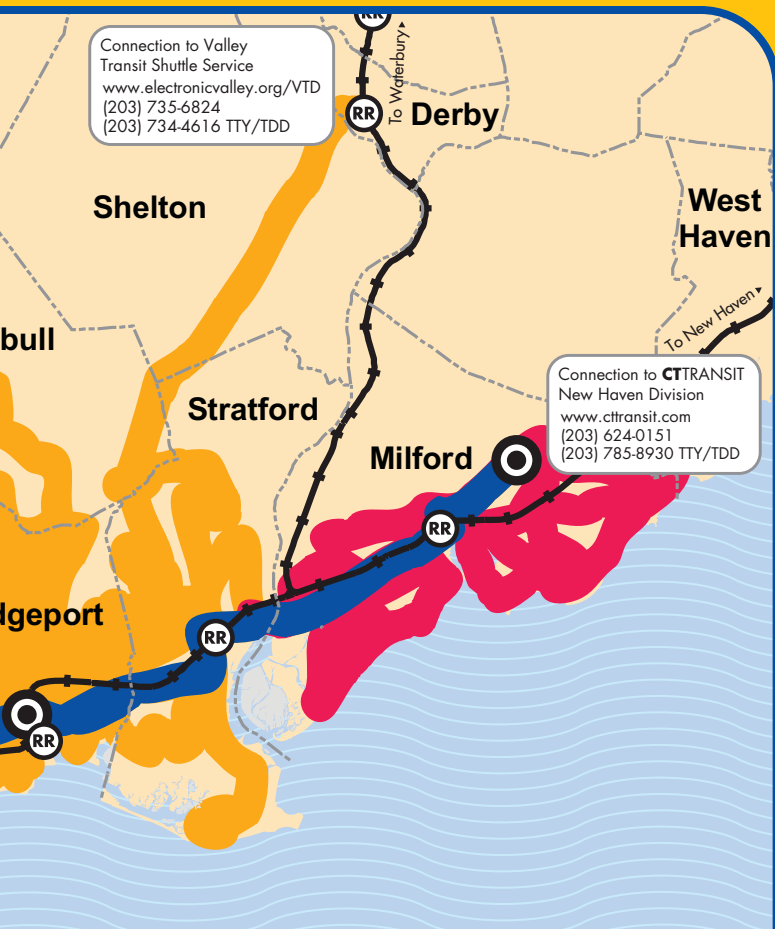

People to Jobs is a program that works to improve public transportation in cities and towns in Southwestern

Connecticut so that residents – including low-income workers and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families recipients – can have better access to jobs. Formed in 1996, the People to Jobs Regional Transportation Task Force, in collaboration with transit operators, decides where additional routes or extended hours of service are needed. People to Jobs also provides transportation planning assistance through the *CTWorks* Career Centers. Staff members are available to assist jobseekers in navigating bus routes for travel to training, job interviews, employment, and childcare.
